#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Population data refers to the number of active employees in organizations under the exclusive appointment authority of the Public Service Commission (employees of organizations named in the *Financial Administration Act* — Schedule I, most of Schedule IV and some agencies in Schedule V). This differs from numbers reported by the Treasury Board Secretariat (TBS) that reflect employment in organizations under the *Public Service Staff Relations Act*. In addition, a number of separate agencies are subject to Part 7 of the *Public Service Employment Act*, which administers the political activities of public servants. The population count represents the number of active employees at a specific point in time.

Population data are derived from the TBS Incumbent File. This file is extracted from the Public Services and Procurement Canada pay system.
